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## Introduction

The Fall Databook reflects data extracted from the Integrated Student Information System (ISIS) at different points in time.


- The Fall [Census Snapshot](#) is taken within a few days of the last day students can drop courses or withdraw for a 100% refund and has usually been within the second week of September.
- The Fall [End-of-Term Snapshot](#) data are frozen several weeks after the end of the semester, usually in early January, which is expected to be enough time for final grades to have been reported to Student Records.
- Data extracted from the [Campus Solutions Warehouse](#) are specific to the day of the extraction and will differ from census or end-of-term snapshots.

Read the notes for each table to determine the point of time of the extraction. The Fall Databook will be updated in September and February, with the last update noted in the header and in the data labels shown within the tables.

Data items are included based on the frequency of requests from campus constituents. *The Fall Databook is not comprehensive nor does it reflect all the data on hand nor all the reporting handled by Institutional Research or other offices.* Contact Institutional Research directly if you have additional data requests or questions.
